SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 16th February 2025



How happy are you who are poor; yours is the kingdom of God.

You can come across a lot of things online, but I happened to stumble upon a criticism of the Catholic Church by another Christian who claimed that Catholics teach falsehoods within the Church, especially around prayers for the dead. So, the question he explored was do Catholics pray to the dead?

Let it be written that Jesus himself, when talking about the afterlife, said in Luke's Gospel "And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive (Lk 20: 37-38)."

The final destination of our prayer is not to the dead but to God. Catholics do not pray to the dead but for the dead. Furthermore, we believe the saints and the angels dwell with the heavenly Father eternally, so they are alive in God as are Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, so we do not pray to them but ask them to pray for us. Much like we would ask someone in the congregation to keep in prayer our aunty who is unwell or our neighbour who suffers depression. The saints and the angels are on our side interceding to God on our behalf.

Our Second Reading this weekend from the first letter to the Corinthians provides the spiritual logic of the resurrection. The concluding remarks of St Paul's letter leave the reader challenged by one of the fundamental beliefs of Christianity; that our sins have been forgiven in Christ and that there's new life beyond death.

Although I cannot say with certainty, I do think this 'Christian' who has criticized the Church must believe in the forgiveness of sins and life beyond death. For if that is the case, then by the logic of one of our earliest brothers in Christ, St Paul, this 'Christian' is incorrect.

Every Mass, we pray for the dead, and we seek the intercession of the saints and the angels. This is not some séance or magical communication, it's an acknowledgment that God is Lord of all souls. This is an acknowledgment that we are all members of the Body of Christ. This is an acknowledgment that after our earthly pilgrimage is done, our life is changed and not ended. May we then, one day, be found worthy to sing in the halls of heaven with the saints and the angels and seek the intercession of our brothers and sisters in Christ who are **alive** in the Lord.

First Reading

Jeremiah 17: 5-8

Gospel Acclamation

The Lord says this:

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

If Christ raised from the dead is what has been preached, how can some of you be saying that there is no resurrection of the dead? For if the dead are not raised, Christ has not been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, you are still in your sins. And what is more serious, all who have died in Christ have perished. If our hope in Christ has been for this life only, we are the most unfortunate of all people.

But Christ has in fact been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep.

Alleluia, alleluia! Rejoice and be glad; your reward is great in heaven. Alleluia!

Gospel

Luke 6: 17, 20-26

Jesus came down with the Twelve and stopped at a piece of level ground where there was a large gathering of his disciples with a great crowd of people from all parts of Judaea and from Jerusalem and from the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon. Then fixing his eyes on his disciples he said:

'How happy are you who are poor: yours is the kingdom of God.

Happy you who are hungry now: you shall be satisfied.

Happy you who weep now: you shall laugh.

Happy are you when people hate you, drive you out, abuse you, denounce your name as criminal, on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice when that day comes and dance for joy, for then your reward will be great in heaven. This was the way their ancestors treated the prophets.

'But alas for you who are rich: you are having your consolation now.

Alas for you who have your fill now: you shall go hungry.

Alas for you who laugh now: you shall mourn and weep.

'Alas for you when the world speaks well of you! This was the way their ancestors treated the false prophets.'


